I'd like to think that there are people lined up waiting to give us the encouragement and the recognition we all deserve. I'd like to believe that, just maybe, the public tide is turning away from the vilification of public school staff, and is beginning to embrace the idea that the public schools and the people who work in them have provided the foundation for some of the greatest thinkers, scientists, entrepreneurs, artists, musicians and writers in the world.

It may take a while for everyone to appreciate and understand the importance of our work, so until Congress agrees with my proposition, remember that your job is vitally important, and please accept my appreciation for all of the work that you do.
